Comm. Paul: The chain saw, there was a bar and some chains that were replaced from the last two storms we had.

We ordered the Hurst Strong Arm that we were looking at, at budget time. That was placed and ordered. That comes with two tips, two batteries, a charger and also two retractable lanyards for the tics. They will be placed on each apparatus.

Turn-Out Gear – Comm. Paul

Comm. Paul: We placed a large order for helmets, fire gloves, rescue gloves, hoods and the shields for the helmets and for the members that need them.

Recruitment / Membership – Comm. Paul

Comm. Paul: Tonight we have Al Smith Jr., and Al Smith III being sworn-in tonight, both for Battalion 1. Hopefully we'll get the Explorer Program finalized tonight.

Comm. Weindel: The guy will be here tomorrow roughly around 5:30pm if anybody needs anything. I already talked to the Chief about it. Any problems or issues with their uniform, we'll square that away. Also I talked to the Chief again about the uniforms, who gets what and when they get it and all that stuff and the policy for wearing the uniform, when we wear them and when we don't wear them, so we're working on a policy for that.

The Aerial testing should be done next month for the new truck and the Ladder. The Squirt, the generator issue is a dead hydraulic pump. He's waiting for that to come in. I told him there is an air leak on the Engine and also there is a problem with the lights on the new truck, so we're going to take care of that. The Engine and the Ladder are having air leak issues, so I had inlets put in both trucks and we're going to move the generator out of the back room at Station 2 to the engine room and run air lines to the trucks so they don't keep on running those pumps on the trucks all the time, and we'll see how that works. That's it.

Dep.Chief Polifrone: If we do not, I've already spoken with Sol.Tavani about some type of thing where they have to notify us and then returning them possibly a fitness for duty examination depending upon the nature of their injury or illness. Because I don't want to get into a situation where we have someone who has back surgery and they get a doctor's note that says yes you can go back to firefighting when the orthopedist has no idea what's involved.

Comm. Weindel: You're talking about non-firefighting related, just general.

Dep.Chief Polifrone: It happened to me, I had a hernia operation and I got a note from my doctor that said I could return to firefighting. I'm sure that doctor had no idea, because they hear volunteer firefighter, they don't put that

in the same perspective as we're doing the same thing as a career firefighter. So I'm going to draft an S.O.G. and present it for approval by the Board.

Sol.Tavani: With the Board's permission, I'll coordinate that with the Deputy Chief?

Comm. Ruth: Yes.




